As project leader, Alentejo Science and Technology Park (PACT) welcomed partners, representatives from 8 countries in the Mediterranean area, for a working session that served to define responsibilities, review the general lines of the project and to approve the first operational documents.

Standardized data collection from MED countries

Each partner started to gather local e-waste data, covering legislation, local key actors such as producers, importers, companies working in waste management, recyclers, reuse organizations, local authorities (municipalities & regional authorities), statistics on the amount of e-waste collected annually, innovative practices, what proportion of e-waste collected is recycled, etc.

In total, we expected to have at least 200 interviews/questionnaires from key actors!

Technical partners ORZ, RSU, PACT and UBBSLA, will lead the consortium in a join process of analysis of the MED market data in order to create a draft MED Methodology.

In the next Newsletter , we will share with you some important findings highlighted during this preliminary analysis on regional/local e-waste market data collected!
